





What is IELCE



IESS



The Integrated English Literacy and Civics Education (IELCE) program helps English learners build workforce and civic skills through:



English instruction connected to real-life work and community settings **Workforce preparation** activities like digital skills and communication **Training** that leads to jobs, credentials, or further education



IELCE must include an **IET component**—instruction that is contextualized, concurrent, and aligned with in-demand jobs.



Why This Matters



IELCE bridges English learners to education, workforce training, and career success.

NC has expanded access, deepened impact, and increased MSG performance over the last four years.

With federal funding potentially shifting, it's important to honor and sustain this work.

Student Success Story: Alfredo Thielen





- Immigrated from Venezuela to NC in June 2022 with 27 years of business and sales experience
- Worked at Texas Roadhouse, then advanced to warehouse coordinator at Design Foundry
- Enrolled in **English and Warehouse/Logistics IET course** at Caldwell Community College

Gained:


- Vocabulary and systems knowledge for warehouse operations
- Skills in inventory control, equipment use, and space management
- Recognized by employer for completing the course
- Now being considered for promotions and additional training opportunities



IELCE Funding and Participation




- IELCE funding remained strong across the grant cycle, peaking in PY 2023–2024 at over \$1.5M.
- Total IET Points of Participation (POPs) more than doubled from PY 2021–2022 to PY 2024– 2025, reflecting increased student engagement.
- The number of funded providers remained stable, averaging around 30 annually, showing consistent statewide implementation.





MSG Achievement





- Total IELCE IET Points of Participation (POPs) increased significantly—from just over 1,000 in PY 2022–2023 to more than 1,700 in PY 2024–2025.
- Measurable Skill Gain (MSG) rates steadily rose, reaching over 70% in the most recent year.
- These trends reflect both broader engagement and stronger learner outcomes.

Partnerships with employers to align training and support placement


